1. Introduction

This integrated document combines the strategic intent of the Cabinet Paper and the practical guidance of the Assessment Framework to serve as the foundational policy for evaluating sugarcane farmers in Fiji. It incorporates Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to ensure inclusive, equitable, and sustainable agricultural development. This foundation will guide the application of the Assessment Form, used to measure and score farmer performance for award selection.

2. Objectives of the Sugarcane Farmers Award

- Recognize exceptional performance and innovation in sugarcane farming.
- Promote sustainable, resilient, and climate-conscious farming practices.
- Encourage equitable participation by recognizing women and young farmers.
- Inspire continuous improvement and peer learning through structured assessment and recognition.
- Support Fiji's national development agenda through alignment with the SDGs.

3. Eligibility Criteria

- · Must be a registered sugarcane farmer in Fiji.
- Open to all ages, genders, and farm sizes.
- Self-nominations and third-party nominations are accepted.

4. Evaluation Framework Overview

The evaluation is conducted using an Assessment Form, which includes both quantitative and qualitative criteria. Scoring is objective, transparent, and aligned with the goals outlined in this document.

4.1 Quantitative Evaluation (60 Points)

- Productivity (t/ha) and total sugarcane production
- Farm record keeping and budgeting practices
- Environmental stewardship and compliance (e.g. trash management, non-burning)
- · Soil health management and input efficiency
- Climate-smart agricultural practices
- · Gender-inclusive practices on the farm
- · Use of mechanization and modern technologies
- · Participation in trainings and extension services
- · Crop diversification strategies

4.2 Qualitative Evaluation (40 Points)

- · Strategic planning (short-term and long-term vision)
- Community leadership and knowledge sharing
- Resilience and innovation in overcoming challenges
- Demonstrated alignment with SDGs 2, 5, 12, and 13

5. Integrity and Fairness in Evaluation

All assessors will receive bias-awareness training and must follow the principle of neutrality in scoring. Diverse assessment panels will be constituted, with at least one female assessor per team. Gender-anonymized evaluations may be used to ensure objectivity.

6. Recognition and Benefits

Awardees will be publicly recognized during the National Sugar Industry Awards Ceremony and will receive cash prizes, certificates, and tokens of appreciation. The initiative also builds their reputation within the farming community.

7. Award Categories

The following awards are proposed for sectors, districts and nation.

7.1 District Awards

- ✓ Best Sugarcane Farmer Award (Highest Production and productivity)
- ✓ Best Young Farmer Award
- ✓ Best Woman Farmer Award

7.2 National Award

- ✓ Prime Minister's Sugarcane Farmer of the Year Award
- ✓ Best Young Farmer Award
- ✓ Best Woman Farmer Award
- ✓ Best Innovative Farmer Award

7.3 Special Recognition

Senior farmers bring invaluable experience, resilience, and best practices to the sugarcane industry. To honor their contribution, the following awards are introduced:

7.3.1 Most Senior Productive Farmer (Male)

 Recognizes the most productive senior male farmer (aged 60+), demonstrating high productivity and sustainable practices.

7.3.2 Most Senior Productive Farmer (Female)

 Recognizes the most productive senior female farmer (aged 60+), demonstrating high productivity and sustainable practices.

7.3.3 Eligibility Criteria for Senior Awards:

- · Must be a registered sugarcane farmer in Fiji.
- · Must be aged 60 years or older.
- Must demonstrate high productivity (average yield over the past three years).
- Must practice sustainable farming (non-burning, soil health management, crop diversification).
- Must maintain good farm records (production, finances, farm management).

7.4 - Special Green Champion Award

 Award that recognize the champion who has given due consideration to climate, quality, environment and harvested highest and 100 percent green cane from one or multiple farms under his or her name.
